YOU CAN HELP! ASK YOUR STATE LEGISLATORS TO SUPPORT THE KIND ACT. SB 3308 and HB 4781.

For too long, Illinois has placed unnecessary hurdles in the way for family members to take in a child when they are removed from a household by DCFS. The KIND Act requires that DCFS provide family caregivers with the same level of financial support that foster homes receive, and provide postplacement supports to family guardians similar to supports provided to adoptive families.

This bill is urgently needed. More than 10,000 youth in DCFS care live with relatives. At least 60% of these youth are unnecessarily denied the foster care benefits they would be entitled to if they were living in a foster home.
